
2032 SUMMER OLYMPICS BID: ROTTERDAM-AMSTERDAM, NETHERLANDS

Rotterdam is the second most populous city in the Netherlands, and in addition, it is the largest seaport in all of Europe. The city's architecture is modern but varied, due to the need for rebuilding much of the city center because of World War II. The citizens of Rotterdam enjoy the city for its prestigious university, dynamic and diverse culture, and its rich history.

AMSTERDAM OLYMPICS, 1928

Amsterdam first hosted the olympics during the summer of 1928, beating out only Los Angeles. It was the first time that the Olympic Flame was lit for the entirety of the Olympics, and took place over the course of 16 days. Additionally, the 1928 games were the first to be labeled as "Summer Olympic Games" in order to distinguish themselves from the winter games.









CONCEPT 1: TORCH & ANCHOR

CONCEPT 1: TORCH & ANCHOR - FINAL


Out of the three concepts I created, I decided to go with the first. Although I was a fan of all three, the first concept was the strongest. It not only connects both cities by using an anchor to showcase each city's authority as seaports, but it also alludes towards the 1928 Olympics hosted in Amsterdam. During this first Dutch Olympics, it was the first time that the torch stayed lit for the entirety of the Olympics, hence the flame in the final design. Moreover, the final logo design is colored with red as a symbol of the everlasting flame. The design has slightly softened edges to indicate friendliness, and the typeface used for the logo, Amsi Pro, also has similarly softened corners to create unity within the combination mark. Additionally, Amsi Pro was a great choice to use since it is condensed, making the logotype more compact.

COMBINATION MARK COLOR STUDY

The logo utilizes the red color pulled from the Olympic logo to emphasize the flame. The rest of the logo is colored black or white depending on the application to ensure a broad range of use cases. Additionally, the Olympic rings are brightly colored to promote a fun, eccentric feel.
